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

PSLE Scoring System

T-SCORE SYSTEM

- O finely differenting students' performance
- O is norm-referenced
 - child's results is actually dependent also on how his peers perform at PSLE

AL SYSTEM

- O less differentiated
- O is standard-referenced
 - determined just by his own performance at PSLE

ACHIEVEMENT LEVEL (AL)

Results in Achievement Level

- Students are less finely differentiated on the basis of every mark.
- Each subject will be scored using 8
 Achievement Levels (ALs), with AL
 1 being the best.
- Students who demonstrate similar achievement for a subject will receive the same AL grade.
- These standards will remain the same from year to year.



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

Secondary

Schools

Government School

Offers high quality education such as unique electives, applied subjects and student development programmes at standardised fees.

Autonomous School

Follow the national syllabus, but offer a wider range of programmes that enhance your child's learning experiences and develop their talents.

Government-aided School

Schools set up by various community organisations to cater to the educational needs of their respective communities.

They maintain the same education standards as Government schools and charge standardised fees.


Independant School

Schools that have the flexibility to set their own fees and develop their academic and non-academic programmes.

TYPES OF SECONDARY SCHOOLS

Specialised Independent School

Offers specialised education catering to students who have talent and strong interests in Mathematics and Science, the Arts, Sports, and applied learning.



Specialised School

Offers an experiential and hands-on learning approach through their customised programmes for students who are inclined towards hands-on and practical learning.




