Dear Parents/ Guardians,

Term 4 Reminders and Updates

As we approach the final term of the year, we have some reminders and updates for you.

Attendance

1. Regular attendance in school is essential, as every lesson contributes to your child's/ward's learning and progress. Absences result in missed learning opportunities that may affect their overall development. We seek your continued support in ensuring that your child/ward attends school consistently.
2. Absence from school must be covered by a medical certificate issued by a doctor if your child / ward is unwell. You may write a letter to inform teachers of the absence of your child / ward. Do note that **we will only accept up to 5 parents' letters** per child/ward **per semester** for absence from school.
3. If your child / ward is unwell and unfit for school during assessments, please notify your child's / ward's form teacher. We advise you to bring your child / ward to the doctor and submit the medical certificate to the form teacher upon your child's / ward's return to school. Absences during assessments must be covered by a valid medical certificate. Students without valid reasons for absence will not be awarded marks for the papers missed.

PSLE Study Break for P6 from Monday, 22 September to Wednesday, 24 September

4. All Primary 6 students will have a 3-day study break prior to the start of the PSLE Written examination. The study break will be from **Monday, 22 September to Wednesday, 24 September**.
5. During the study break, P6 students are strongly encouraged to remain at home. Students who require assistance from their teachers may do so through online consultations. If students require face-to-face consultation, they should make prior arrangements with the teachers. Selected students may also be asked to return for support classes. The NASCANS Student Care Centre in schools will remain open in the afternoons during the study break for students who require their service.
6. Students should continue with the good habits of early rise in the mornings, have sufficient sleep and maintain a healthy diet during this period.

Home-Based Learning for P2, P3, P4 Students During Selected Days of PSLE Written

7. Primary 2, Primary 3 and Primary 4 students will have **one day** of Home-Based Learning (HBL) during the week of PSLE.

8. On these days, students will remain at home to complete tasks assigned by the teachers. The NASCANS Student Care Centre in school will operate from 7.30 am for **students who do not have available caregivers at home**.
9. More details on the HBL will be given later.

Last Day of School on Thursday, 20 November & P1 2026 Orientation on Friday, 21 November

10. The last day of the academic year will be on **Thursday, 20 November**.
- P1 to P5 students will report to school as usual at 7.30 am and be **dismissed at 10.30 am**. NASCANS Student Care Centre in school will operate from 10.30 am.
 - P6 students will report to school at **4.00 pm** for their Graduation Nite.
11. The school will be holding the P1 Orientation for incoming P1 students on **Friday, 21 November**.

After-School Activities

12. For the safety of our students who are involved in after-school activities such as CCA or support/enrichment programmes, they are expected to stay in school upon school dismissal. They are not allowed to leave the school premises and then return to school to participate in these activities. This will also allow the school to keep track of the whereabouts of our students before the commencement of their after-school activities.
13. While students are in school, they should visit the library for reading-related activities. They could also use the time to revise or complete their schoolwork.
14. We also seek your cooperation to ensure that your child/ward has sufficient allowance for lunch as the canteen stalls will remain open for students staying back for after-school activities. Please also make the necessary transport arrangements for your child / ward to return home. These arrangements should be clearly communicated with your child / ward to avoid confusion.



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Students with Medical Conditions

15. Students who have medical conditions, such as asthma, must bring their personal medication with them to school. The medication must be clearly labelled with the child's/ward's name and class. Do ensure that the medication is not expired, and your child / ward knows how to administer the medication himself / herself.

16. Please inform the school immediately if your child / ward has a medical condition. This will allow teachers to monitor the students' well-being.
